Marie Elizabeth (Boudreau) Bitner passed away on August 28, 2021 at the age of 96. She was born on September 28, 1924 in Detroit, MI to the daughter of late Clement Alton and late Helen (Duquette) Boudreau

She is the only person who has ever said to me, "don't retire too soon. You should have a long time to be retired. If you like your work and find it rewarding, don't retire too soon"

Tammi and Terri became like daughters in some ways and thank you both for your great great care, love and all your time. Anyone visiting aunt betty with a little meal had to be astonished how full her freezer was of beautiful homemade meals to warm up in the microwave. She loved meatloaf.

She was worried a few months before Covid that she was forgetting things. She had a few things she wanted her grandchildren to have and I ended up helping her put sticky notes and suggesting she just give them the items when next she saw so she could stop worrying. She went round and round about something special but masculine for James,
i think it finally was a little pewter dish.

Lastly remember the fun she had traveling up north, pinconning and cheese, and the ride to the top of the hills at Boyne on a snowmobile with the austrian ski instructors with my mom one year. How delighted they both were with the view and the experience!

How blessed each one of us was to have her in our lives.

Being two months in Hospice, I kept remembering how Aunt Betty never wanted to leave a party! At every family party, I remember Uncle Johnnie saying over and over, "Marie, Marie, get your coat, we got to go!". Aunt Betty would take a few steps closer to the door but continue with her cheerful, lovely voice and laughter talking away to her family members. A minute later, here goes Uncle Johnny again and again, "Marie! Marie!".

Sons Johnny and Jimmy were the light of Aunt Betty's life and her happiness was interwoven with their lives and families. It took her two months in hospice to be able to leave this party on earth for the glorious reunion she is having now.
