Months later, I signed up for the Friday afternoon shift when I started working at the Pantry not realizing Therese had been working on that shift for years. (It was a tough slot to keep staffed with dependable volunteers as it is the prelude to any weekend plans for many people). We paired up to work together in the back room where clients selected items they were eligible for and did their monthly shopping. She was "vertically challenged" (as we used to say). When she couldn't reach the higher shelves for items needed by her clients, she would call me over to climb up to get them for her--and I was happy to assist. It was a pleasure to work during that 3 hour shift knowing that the Pantry's outreach was making a difference in the lives of people less fortunate than ourselves. She was always smiling, enjoyed life, and was fun to be around because she also had a great sense of humor! A couple of years ago, when I knew her birthday was approaching, I asked her if I could take her on a special outing for that day. A few months prior, Therese had mentioned to me that she had never been to the grotto at the Orchard Lake Seminary dedicated to the Blessed Mother-- plus I knew she was deeply devoted to saying the rosary. COVID-19 was a factor then, too, so I knew the grotto would be the perfect place for us to pray the rosary together outdoors. As a birthday gift to surprise her, I located a unique St. Therese rosary designed with carved gold rose buds and had it blessed. Because COVID-19 restrictions were imposed for restaurants, there were only a few serving indoors--one of which was Toni's Deli right around the corner from the grotto. Once we were seated and settled in, Therese commented on how beautiful the rosary was. She told me that although she had many rosaries, she planned to keep this at her bedside as her "good one." There were many lunches, road trips, and lengthy phone conversations-- and all the time good times we spent together will be cherished. I will really miss her!
